

The old Taiwan Sugar Co. pulp mill has a new life as a public park, the military settlement has been reimagined as a creative cultural center, and the Japanese-era hotel is now host to a chic café. Even the staid old library got the memo on retro modernism. Pingtung City has held on to the memories of its residents while pushing forward into a bright new future. Now it's waiting for you to come experience it for yourself.

Hidden in Qianxi Park, the Pingtung County Library is full of more than just books, it also holds many memories for locals. The building is over 30 years old and has been renovated with an all-new look that combines modern and retro styles. This design takes full advantage of the location's natural beauty, with each of the library's 700 reading seats facing the forest. Trees are the best reading buddies because they will never interrupt your book.



2 \ Innovative park design with walking trails, a water park, and a performance stage /

The park gets its name from the Japanese pronunciation of the characters for Pingtung and the year the Taiwan Sugar Co. pulp mill was established. The industrial land was transformed into an innovative public park, preserving a pit that was part of the historic mill and turning five water treatment tanks into a sand pit, a trampoline, a water-lined walkway, and a performance stage. This creative use of land gives new life to Pingtung's history as a place for fun and leisure.

3 \ Check out the shops in a traditional Japanese settlement /

Shengli Star Village Creative Life Park V.I.P. Zone

Shengli Star Village is Taiwan's largest heritage building revitalization project and has helped foster the local creative community. In row upon row of colonial Japanese homes you will find an indie bookshop, café, restaurant, craft store, and even a chic little inn in which you can spend the night. Shengli Star Village is uniquely beautiful, which is only fitting for Pingtung's one-of-a-kind lifestyle.

4 \ Exploring Pingtung / one cup at a time /

Pingtung City Café Crawl

The relaxed pace of Pingtung City has given rise to its own unique coffee culture. Whether it's a stylishly renovated classical home, the aroma of a select brew, a carefully crafted meal, or the taste of an expertly prepared cup of coffee, you'll find exactly what you need at one of the many cafes lining the streets of the city. There's no better way to get to know the local culture than to explore every nook and cranny of the city looking for all its hidden gems.



Chaozhou Local for a Day

The little hamlet of Chaozhou knows exactly what you want – that chill life. But despite its small size, it packs a punch when it comes to food; clustered around the central roundabout are eateries to satisfy any craving, be it for something hot or cold, sweet or savory. There's no shortage of culture either. Visitors can get lost in the history of the old Japanese residential quarter. And stepping out from the tree-lined streets you'll find yourself enveloped in a vast forest – the kind of wide-open nature you can really stretch yourself out in.



5 \ Eat like a local /

Chaozhou Roundabout

The roundabout is a Chaozhou landmark and the center of the community's food culture. The locals come here for swordfish tempura, grilled corn, pork belly buns, Hakka-style flat rice noodles with sweet and spicy fried squid, pork, and shrimp. We dare you to just try and resist. And don't forget dessert! "Hot and cold ice" is a Chaozhou classic. The contrast of the hot ingredients like taro, peanuts, and rice dumplings on ice is an absolute delight for the taste buds.

6 \ History that's real to the touch /

Chaozhou Japanese Historical Architecture Cultural Park

● No. 22, Yanping Rd., Chaozhou Township, Pingtung County

When you see it, you'll know – the Chaozhou Japanese Historical Architecture Cultural Park is unmistakable. The wooden houses have been preserved from the Japanese colonial period and turned into a recreational and information center where visitors can come to learn about the history of Chaozhou. While you're here, you can put on a Japanese yukata and experience for yourself what it was like in the past and learn about Lin Shao-mao's war of resistance against Japan and how the area changed after the conflict.



7 \ Experience the open country by bike /

Linhausilin Forest Park

During the Japanese colonial period, Linhausilin was an important part of the local sugar cane industry. But as the industry waned, the sugar cane plantations were replaced with a forest park that became the poster child for sustainability and a low-carbon future. Rent a bike to ride through the wide-open countryside and take in the magnificence of the surroundings.



8 \ 1.2km of tree-lined tranquility /

Chaozhou Green Tunnel

● Ln. 802, Chaozhou Rd., Chaozhou Township, Pingtung County



Also known as Silin Walking Trail, this is the most beautiful stroll you can take in all of Pingtung. Nearly 500 Madagascar almond trees line the entire 1.2km path, with their slender branches reaching across the road to create a canopy overhead. Run, walk, or ride a bike in its shade and feel the stress of daily life just melt away.



A Stroll Through Jiadong and Nanzhou

The banks of the Linbian River are lined with historical architecture from traditional residences to western-style buildings and ancient structures like Jiadong's West Bar Gate. These relics of the past are a portal through time where you can witness the history of the Indigenous Seqalu, the development of the land by the Hakka people, and the rise of the sugar cane industry during the Japanese colonial period. It's a historical drama played out in the setting of Jiadong and Nanzhou Townships.



9 \ Walk the corridors of the past /

Jiadong Traditional Residences

● Hsiao Family Old House, Chang Family House, Yang Family Ancestral Hall, and the West Bar Gate (See appendix for details)

Jiadong is an important part of the history of Liudui. As trade and commerce grew, so did the number of influential families and the grand residences and ancestral shrines that they built. There's the historic Hsiao Family Old House, the century-old Chang Family House, the Yang Family Ancestral Hall, the West Bar Gate, and the Jingzi Pavilion to name a few. Jiadong is simply bursting with culture around every corner.



10 \ Authentic flat noodle surf and turf /

Jiadong flat rice noodles

● Hsiao's Flat Rice Noodles, Changlong Station Flat Rice Noodles, A-Ma's Flat Rice Noodle Shop, and A-Zhi's Flat Rice Noodles (See appendix for details)

The Hakka people have a long history in Jiadong. With the ocean nearby their traditional flat rice noodles are different from those of other Hakka settlements. The soup base is made of tuna simmered for hours and mixed with braised pork. The result is a refreshing, elevated flavor rich with savory notes from the ocean that you just can't get enough of.

11 \ Taiwan's southernmost / sugar refinery /

TaiSugar Nanzhou Refinery

Built in 1920, the TaiSugar Nanzhou Refinery is the southernmost sugar factory on the island and, for a time, was the driving force behind the township's economic prosperity. In 2003 it was turned into a tourist attraction where visitors can visit a fishpond, cook with an earth oven, and take a ride on a train. It's fun for the whole family! The factory is no longer making sugar, but a visit to the TaiSugar Nanzhou Refinery is sure to leave you with many sweet memories.

12 \ Get a taste of the past at a / traditional market /

Nanzhou Market

Step into the Nanzhou Market and you'll be transported back in time by the carefully arranged stalls and white tiles. Come for the traditional breakfast, but stick around and try the rice soup, radish cakes, chilled tapioca pearl shaved ice, fried rice noodles, and bowls of waisheng noodles. The Nanzhou Market gathers the best of the local cuisine and is where locals from all walks of life come to satisfy their hunger.

Temples Galore!

To get to the spiritual heart of Pingtung, the best route is along the Gaoping River to the townships of Wandan and Xinyuan. The most famous temple is Wanhui Temple, but if you're looking for love you can't miss the Temple of the Holy Mother and Father. Get to know the legend of the sea goddess Mazu and why she's known as the bomb catcher, and see for yourself this place so steeped in art and culture. But after feeding your soul, don't forget to feed your belly with the local delicacies and fresh seafood.



13 \ The most ornate temple in Pingtung /

Wandan Wanhui Temple

● No. 1660, Wanxin Rd., Wandan Township, Pingtung County

In the courtyard of Wanhui Temple there is a statue of a golden hand catching a bomb. Legend has it that in WWII, during a bombing raid, Mazu appeared and caught a bomb as it fell from the sky, protecting the locals from its blast. As a result, the locals come here often to pay their respects. But Wanhui Temple is also a testament to the skills of local master craftsmen. The mosaics on the eaves were designed by master Hong Shun-fa and the pillars were carved by masters Huang Gui-li and Yang Xiu-xing. The temple has become known as the most exquisite in all of Pingtung.



14 \ Taste all that Wandan / has to offer

Wandan Snack Street

● Wanshou Rd. and Wandan Rd. intersection, Wandan Township, Pingtung County



You'll know you're getting close to the intersection of Wandan Rd. and Wanshou Rd. just by following your nose. The area is central to Wandan's food culture. Here you'll find sweet red bean cakes, rich lamb curry, and the impossible-to-miss stinky tofu. There's also hot and cold ice, beef soup, rice soup, swordfish tempura, and rainbow tapioca pearl shaved ice. And that's just the beginning. It's a 100-meter strip simply bursting with flavor.

15 \ We all could use a little luck /

Baibafan Wulong Temple of the Holy Mother and Father

● Zhongxing Rd., Xinyuan Township, Pingtung County

Baibafan Wulong Temple of the Holy Mother and Father is where the locals come to pray for love. The Holy Mother and Father are a legendary couple who were very wealthy, owning large tracts of land, and bore no children despite having a loving relationship. With no successors, they bestowed their assets on the local Guo family. To repay their generosity, the Guos built a temple in their honor. Visitors to the temple are permitted to move the effigies of the Holy Mother and Father, and whether the two statues face each other or face away can have different significances.



16 \ Fresh from the ocean /

Xinyuan Seafood

● A-Chin Seafood, Ciousyong Seafood (See appendix for details)

Xinyuan is on the coast just north of Donggang Yanbu Fishing Harbor and many locals work in the fishing industry. And with a ready source of fresh seafood just next door, it's no wonder there're so many seafood restaurants in the area selling fish soup, fried soft-shelled crab, grilled squid, mahi mahi, and what the locals call "that fish" (a type of lizardfish)—all at great prices.

Fishing Village Downshift

Before the Linbian River flows into the ocean, it turns back again as if taking one last look at all that Linbian has to offer. Despite being Pingtung's smallest township, the area is packed with wetlands, nature parks, and farms. The sweet wax apples growing in the salty sea breeze is a symbol of the region's many layers.



17 \ Peek into the past /

Fuji Old Residence (Cheng Old Residence)

● No. 8, Rongnong Rd., Linbian Township, Pingtung County

Hidden deep within Linbian's biggest village of Yongle is an elegant old manor home. "Fuji" was the name of a grocery store run by the Cheng family. So, the locals used to use "Fuji Old Residence" as a nickname to refer to the Cheng family's home. But look closely and you'll find that the compound's three-sided layout, known as "Sanheyuan", is an encyclopedia of traditional architectural styles proudly showing off scroll-shaped windows, swooping eaves, arched doorways, wall mouldings, cat doors, and a seven-roomed main building. Only the most dignified of families could have lived here.



18 \ Lend a hand, from the farm /
to the table

Linbian Guangcai Wetland Hobby Farm

The agricultural land in the Guangcai Wetlands was turned into a solar energy farm after ocean water made the land too salty for crops. But to keep the area's rural charm, a local conservation group, the Linzhibian Natural History Conservation Society, created the Guangcai Wetland Hobby Farm where visitors can try their hand at creating local delicacies like salted and hundred-year-old eggs. This first-hand experience will take you through the whole process, from farm to table, bringing you closer to the local culture.

19 \ Nature is the best /
teacher

Qifeng Wetlands

● Qifeng Wetlands, Linbian Township,
Pingtung County



The vast Qifeng Wetlands sits right between the Zuo An (West Bank) Wetland Park of the Linbian drainage channel and Dapeng Bay and is a natural reservoir for the surrounding wildlife. It's also an open-air classroom where visitors can learn all about the local ecology while walking along the park's zigzagging "Nine-Turn Bridge" or catching sight of spectacular water birds from a special bird watching platform. Surrounded by luscious greenery and colorful birds it's like stepping into a painting—one that you will want to spend all day looking at.



20 \ You've never had giant grouper like this /

Linbian Seafood Restaurants

● Renhe Fish Soup, Shui Yue Xuan Xian Xia Mei Shi (shrimp restaurant),
YungShing Seafood (See appendix for details)

The coast along Linbian and Jiadong Townships has become a major producer of grouper fish—and where there's great fish, there's sure to be excellent restaurants. The area is home to a host of old eateries that have been around for generations, each with their own special dish, including shrimp paste soup, crab and flatfish with cabbage stew, and honeycomb oyster omelet to name a few. With so much delicious food to offer, it's no wonder Linbian is famous for its cuisine. So famous, in fact, that Taiwanese people will make a special detour to eat here when passing south to Kenting.



The Cozy Hamlet of Fangliao

Fangliao, where the mountains meet the sea, is also the northern edge of the Hengchun Peninsula, Taiwan's southernmost tip. Fangliao is a small community with tiny alleys and little streets. In a word—quaint. There are two types of travelers; those who plan every detail and those who like to go with the flow. Fangliao is perfect for those who like to take it easy. And after taking it all in, you can hop on the Breezy Blue commuter train to add a dash of whimsy to your travels.

21 \ Feel the gentle sea breeze /

Fangliao Fishing Harbor

Fangliao Fishing Harbor sits just beside Fang-Liao Station and is the final stretch of land before arriving at the ocean. Stretched across the water is the elegantly arched blue lover's bridge, adding a touch of romance to the scene, especially on an evening with a glowing sunset. There's no better place to feel the gentle sea breeze than sitting under the covered patio of an outdoor stir-fry seafood restaurant in anticipation of the delicious food to come.



22 \ Sending off the White Crane /

Beishiliao Bao'an Temple

● No. 215, Bao'an Rd., Fangliao Township, Pingtung County

It was on the second day of the fifth month of the lunar calendar that Baosheng Dadi, the Deity of Medicine, ascended to the heavens and became immortal. That day is commemorated each year in Fangliao's Bao'an Temple with a "Sending Off the White Crane" ceremony, which is found nowhere else in Taiwan. A beautiful white crane is made of fine paper, bamboo, and wood because it is said that Baosheng Dadi rose

into the sky on the wings of a great crane. This unique ritual of Fangliao has been listed as one of Taiwan's folk and cultural assets.

23 \ The starting point of the /
South-link line

Fang-Liao Station

The South-link line which connects Taiwan's east and west coasts, begins in Fangliao, and the train station here is the only one in Taiwan running the Breezy Blue commuter service. These classic blue trains will not only take you over the mountains, but they'll also transport you back in time, and they've become an important part of the annual Reading Festival in Pingtung. What could be more romantic than reading a good book as you chug along the glittering coast with the warm sea breeze wafting through the open train window?

24 \ Feasting in the afterglow of sunset /

Fangliao Seafood Restaurants

● Ada Seafood, Gaoxing Seafood Restaurant, Pi Coconut Bistro

Seafood is easy to come by in Fangliao, with the region a major producer of Taiwan's king prawns, fourfinger threadfin, and giant grouper. It's little wonder then that the seafood restaurants here are known across the country. There are old establishments that have been running for at least half a century famous for their traditional flavors, and there are chic modern eateries built specially to highlight the magnificent ocean view. The secret is to come for dinner just before the sunset, so you can have your meal in the afterglow of the sun.

Tranquil Train Station

Perched atop the coastal cliffs, Fangshan is like a mythical roc living on the Hengchun Peninsula with half its body in the Taiwan Strait and its back resting against mango covered mountains. It lies in wait for the first rays of the summer sun, which it makes into the famously fragrant Aiweng mangoes. One of the best ways to see all of this beauty is on the Breezy Blue commuter train as it glides along the boundary between blue and green, sea and mountain.

25 \ The little lonely train station / with a big secret

Fangshan Station

Fangshan Station is Taiwan's most southern scenic train station. With services and visitors both few and far between, it has often been called the forgotten station. When a train does arrive at the little building nestled between the mountain and the sea, it ambles up to the platform at a leisurely pace. But this little station has a big secret; just a three-minute walk away is a view of the Taiwan Strait so vast and so blue it will take your breath away.



26 \ A post office that doubles as 3D art /

Taiwan's postal service is famous for selling green and white postage boxes sporting a picture of a shrike on the front. The Fangshan Post Office has gone one step further and painted the entire building in the livery of the iconic box. Bursting through the cardboard are Aiweng mangoes and onions, produce that the area is known for, to show off the office's produce mailing service. To cap it all, every hour on the hour the roof opens up like a cardboard box with the whole performance powered by solar energy. Make sure you bring your selfie stick before you come, because with this much personality you will definitely want to take a picture with the building.

27 \ Nothing says summer like mangoes /

Aiweng Mangoes

Arriving at Fangshan, the first thing you'll notice are the mountain slopes blanketed in mango trees straining under the weight of the mouth-watering fruit. The Aiweng mangoes of Fangshan are second to none because of the area's powerful sun. As the trees soak up the rays, they turn them into bright red juicy mangoes. The fruit ripens in the summer, and once you've had your fill, don't forget to buy a box or two to take back home with you.




28 \ The Rainbow of Shihzih Township /

Kayoufeng Falls

Kayoufeng Falls, which used to be known as Neishih or Damenkeng waterfall, is a 40-meter-high waterfall located at the source of the Ashiwen River. When the water levels are high, the waterfall cascades down in a great fan shape, spraying its mist out all around and casting off a fabulous rainbow. That's why Kayoufeng Falls is also known as "The Rainbow of Shihzih Township".


